We all yearn to be welcomed and belong. Our faith calls us to stretch and grow beyond our comfort zone or, as Pope Francis is so fond of saying, "go out of ourselves".

Hospitality is a hallmark of discipleship. Jesus considered it so important that he made hospitality a measure by which we will be judged. Think about the Corporal Works of Mercy. So, why is hospitality so important for Christians? What does welcoming entail?

Hospitality is grounded in our conviction that all human beings, regardless of status, state of life or cultural background, have worth and dignity. This conviction manifests itself in respecting and accepting not just those who are comfortably similar to us but also those, especially those, who are unfamiliar or seem strange or foreign.

Hospitality and welcoming demands a level of openness that some might find scary. Let the letter to the Hebrews remind us "Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels" (13:2). How do you show hospitality in our Parish?

First Reading: Isaiah 50:5-9a

Isaiah describes the willingness of the Suffering Servant to submit to the persecution of his enemies. This willingness stems from true faith in God, and the knowledge that the Lord will always be his help.

Second Reading: James 2:14-18

James states that if some one is hungry and you wish them well but do not help them, you have done them no good. He compares this to stating your faith, without backing it up with your actions. He reminds us that we must show our faith through our good works.

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

Jesus taught his disciples that as the Messiah, he had to suffer much, be put to death, and rise three days later. Peter began to disagree and Jesus reprimanded him for judging by human standards rather than by God's. He told them that whoever would be willing to lose their life for the sake of Jesus and the gospel, will in fact preserve their life forever.
