

Jesus Calls us to Continue His Mission

Jesus opens the ears of a man who is deaf. (Mark 7:31-37) His lack of hearing separates the man who is deaf from society. He experiences the world as silent. Worse, his deafness impedes his speech and silences his voice in the conversation of the human community. These challenges marginalize the man and leave the seeing of his eyes and the commitments of his heart without words. Yet, this man communicates. He has friends, these friends beg Jesus to lay his hand on him. When Jesus says, "Be opened", he opens the man's ears to human conversation and gives him a voice. In fact, as events turn out, the miracle sets this man, who is a Gentile, free to participate fully in Jesus mission. For once Jesus looses his tongue and calls him into speech, he cannot be silenced nor can his friends. They will not keep Jesus healing power secret. They tell everyone the amazing healing the man has experienced. The miracle story shows us in cameo that God wants wholeness and freedom for all people.

Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

Two of the disciples ask Jesus that they be allowed to sit at his right and left side when he comes into his glory. Jesus explains that they should not be concerned with their position. Instead they should concern themselves with serving others just as Jesus was planning to serve many in giving his own life for their sins.
