Pastors' Desk

Jesus' Disciples Argue About Who is the Greatest

Mark's Gospel (9:30-37) raises the question people ask in every age: *Why must we suffer?* None of us escapes suffering; many of the losses we experience leave us feeling as if we are invincible.

Mark's Gospel begins not with an infancy narrative like Matthew and Luke; but with the voice of one crying out in the wilderness - suggesting suffering. In this Gospel we read of the conflict and suffering that lies ahead for him. He will be handed over and killed but will rise again on the third day. In chapter 9 of Mark it focuses on one of the less elegant moments for Jesus' followers. In the chapters leading up to these passages, Peter, James and John have experienced Jesus transfigured in glory. All the disciples have witnessed Jesus heal a child.

We expect their experiences might hold the disciples in a permanent attitude of amazement. But they can't manage it. They can't hold onto these moments. We find them breathtakingly smallminded. How do you hold onto moments of amazement?

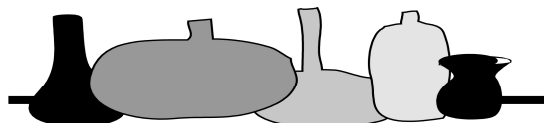

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:10-16

Elijah asked a widow for a cup of water and a piece of bread. She told him she was almost out of flour, and that she and her son would soon starve. Elijah told her not to be afraid, as God had told him the jar of flour would not go empty. So she did as he had asked and prepared bread from the last of her flour. As God had said, her jar did not go empty, and she and her son had plenty to eat.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

The high priests entered the sanctuary each year and offered a sacrifice, but not a sacrifice of their own blood. Just as people die once and are judged, Christ was offered up once for the sins of many.

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Jesus expressed disgust over the hypocrisy of some of the scribes for wanting special treatment from the people. He watched the wealthy put large contributions into the collection box, but explained that what they gave was surplus wealth, and not a real sacrifice. He told them the biggest donation was a small amount from a widow, because she had given up the only money that she had to live on.
