Second Sunday of Lent

"Lord, it is good for us to be here!" (Mt. 17:4)

We can certainly relate to the disciples' desire to set up tents on the mountainside and settle in to savor the transfiguration. This feeling is what inspires pilgrimages to famous shrines like Lourdes and Fatima that seem to radiate divine energy and presence. Not all of us can travel to the iconic shrines of faith, but we have personal shrines that represent key moments of faith, hope or love. These might include the house where we grew up, the parish where we got married or a nature trail where we felt mystical awareness. Revisiting those shrines evokes a flood of memories and graces. Suddenly we realize with the disciples, "Lord, it is good for us to be here."

First Reading: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

God told Abram that he would give him the land of Egypt and his descendants would become a great people. Abram then made sacrifices to God, cutting them in half. A torch passed between the pieces, as a visible sign to Abram of God's promise.

Second Reading: Philippians 3:17—4:1

Paul urges the Philippians to avoid becoming too interested in material possessions. He reminds them that their most important wealth is their faith in Jesus, which will lead them to eternal life.

Gospel: Luke 9:28b-36

Jesus took Peter, John and James to a mountain to pray. When his clothes grew incredibly white, Moses and Elijah appeared. They spoke of the scripture he was to fulfill. Then a cloud came down and a voice said, This is my Son, my Chosen One. Listen to him. The disciples who had seen Jesus' glory did not disclose this experience to anyone until much later.

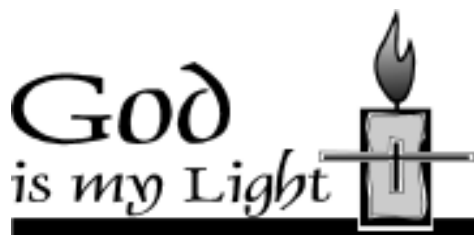
