Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Pastors Desk - In Loving Harmony

“Honor your father and mother.” This is the first commandment with a promise: “so that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth.” (Ephesians 6:2-3)

St. Paul is directing this commandment toward children, reminding them of their duty to obey their parents. He is quoting one of the Ten Commandments, which shows us that the early Christians understood the continuity between Old and New Testaments. St. Paul is aware that good order in the family requires a structure of authority. If everyone insists on doing whatever they please, the result would be chaos and hurt feelings. Moreover, children often do not know how to choose what is good for them; they need direction and guidance from their parents.

On their part, parents are required to exercise their authority with reasonableness and with love. St. Paul urges parents not to “provoke your children to anger”, and I might add “Nor burden them with unreasonable demands or restrictions.” This is a daily challenge for parents and requires prayer for guidance.

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21

Elijah the prophet followed God's instruction to appoint a man named Elisha as his successor. Elijah threw his cloak over Elisha, who went and said good-bye to his family, then followed Elijah without question.

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Paul reminds us that people were freed from the old law through Christ. But he makes it clear that this freedom does not mean giving in to evil desires. Instead, we must be guided by the Spirit and most importantly love our neighbor as ourselves.

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

Jesus set out for Jerusalem, and passed through a town where he was not welcomed. He reprimanded his disciples for desiring vengeance against the town. One man wanted to follow Jesus when he had finished his duties at home. Jesus expressed that a man who begins a task, but constantly looks back is unfit for the reign of God.

The sense of urgency of a disciple is weakened, as the challenge of discipleship is sounded. Pope Francis has designated all of us as 'missionary disciples.' My journey today is based upon my encounter and relationship with Jesus. His call continues, the urgency of building the kingdom is real and repeated today. I ask myself, 'what does it mean to make the promise to 'follow' Him?'
