Seeking and finding

One of the most powerful gospels can be found in Luke 15 1-32.

Seeking and finding: When you think about it, there are basically three different settings in which you seek and find. There is loosing something, where by you begin a diligent search to find it. There is the game of "hide and go seek" where you purposely hide so as not to be found. And there is hunting, where you seek someone or something who hides out of fear. Seeking and finding is different for each setting.

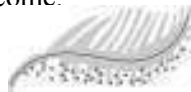
The Gospel finds Jesus surrounded by tax collectors and sinners. To share a meal and have conversation while teaching someone is to share your life with them. The Pharisees and Scribes considered it a scandal that Jesus was sharing his life and table with such as these. Yet Jesus goes right into the midst of sinners to be as close as possible to them. He wanted to bring them out of sin and darkness to God. Jesus reveals God as one who goes in search of those who are lost to bring them back to Himself. When we understand the setting of this gospel we can then see the context of these beautiful parables.

-A shepherd leaves his heard and goes in search of the one lost sheep.

-A woman loses one silver coin and searches and cleans her home leaving no spot untouched.

-The prodigal son has a different twist. Rather then focusing on the son, it focuses on the father.

These parables reveal God as treasuring us beyond all else. God never gives up on us. We, like countless prodigal children before us, must come back to our loving God by taking advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. God is present, not to scold and punish, but to console and welcome.



First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

The prophet Habakkuk cries out despairingly to God because of the state Jerusalem has fallen into. He asks why God does nothing to stop the violence and misery. God assures him that a time will come when only the just and faithful will live.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Paul writes to Timothy from prison and urges him to continue to spread the gospel without fear or shame. He also tells Timothy to draw upon the strength of the Holy Spirit to help him face the hardships he will encounter while preaching.

Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that "faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore," indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all. Jesus also explains that a servant will not receive gratitude for simply following his master's orders. In the same way, we are all God's servants doing no more than our duty when we obey God's commands.
