#### God wants to heal us

Jesus does not want to act alone, he came to bring the love of God into the world and he wants to spread it in the style of communion and brotherhood. That is why he immediately forms a community. He trains them right away for the mission to go forth. Their purpose is not to socialize and spend time together but to proclaim God's kingdom, and this is urgent! It is still urgent today! #### First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

In this beautiful passage, a messianic prophecy, Isaiah exults in the coming of the Lord, who will bring justice and peace for all.

#### Second Reading: Romans 15:4-9

Paul reveals to us the necessity of living in peace and harmony. His words "Accept one another, then, as Christ accepted you, for the Glory of God" are as needed today as they were in Paul's own time.

#### Gospel: Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptizer prepares the way for Jesus. Clothed in a garment of camel's hair, he baptizes the people in the Jordan River, but warns the Pharisees in ringing tones that they must give evidence that they mean to reform.

## Free Throw Championship

This year's Free Throw contest will be held on January 14, 2017 at 9:00 am at St. Christopher's All Purpose room. Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship is open to boys and girls between the ages of 10 and 14. High School age athletes should be advised to check with their school athletic directors or their state's high school athletic association regarding possible eligibility conflicts. Each youngster may compete in only one council competition. Local champions may not represent more than one council. Championships entrants compete against youngsters of the same age and gender in five age divisions: 10,11,12,13 and 14. At the council level, each competitor gets 15 free throws, and the one who makes the most shots win.

Entries in the Knights of Columbus Substance Abuse Awareness Poster Contest must fall under one of these topics: Alcohol Awareness and Abuse & Drug Awareness Abuse.
